1. Collaborative Updates

1.a. Staffing

- NorthBEAT said goodbye to Shevaun Nadin, and adapted its staffing makeup. Introduced Heather Zachozy (Youth and Family Advisory Groups, Day to Day Support) and Doug Eddington (Stakeholder Engagement) as new members of the NorthBEAT Coordinating Team.

1.b. Member Updates

- Welcome to the newest members of the Collaborative, added since our launch (Thunder Bay Counselling Centre, Dryden Regional Health Centre, Nishnawbe Aski Nation, First Nations and Inuit Health Branch, Sioux Lookout Zone, CMHA-Fort Frances, CMHA-Kenora, CMHA-Thunder Bay, North of Superior Counselling Programs) and those in process of signing (Lakehead University Student Health and Wellness, ONWA, KO Chiefs)

1.c. Youth Advisory Group/Family and Lived Experience Advisory Group Updates

- The Youth Advisory Group (YAG) and Family and Lived Experience Advisory Group have been established, and will be meeting on a monthly basis moving forward. The YAG's first meeting was held in November, with the FLAG's meeting scheduled for Nov 29/18.
- Youth Advisory Group (34 members), Family and Lived Experience Advisory Group (10 members).

1.d. Member Profiles

- Starting in January, we will be featuring a different Collaborative Member each month, and have them answer questions related to what youth need to know about their organizations. YAG and FLAG members will be encouraged to participate and submit questions. Carole will be sending an email in the near future to go in to further detail.

1.e. Resource Mapping

- Thanks to all for sharing your resources, tools and information for our resource mapping. We are starting to map of these together to create a comprehensive collection of what's available to service providers and youths and their families in the district. The plan for this mapping is an interactive map of Northwestern Ontario, with access to information about services, as well as the context of accessing those services. This map will be imbedded in the eLearning training modules. Collaborative members will be approached when the prototype is developed to assist in identifying gaps.

1.f. Check-in Survey:

- An email survey will be sent out in the next few weeks. This is an opportunity for us to get your feedback on the Collaborative activities over the last year, and what we should keep doing, start doing, or stop doing.

2. eLearning

- Welcome to Angela Van Barneveld and her team as our learning experts. Angela provided further background on her and her team. eLearning is currently in content analysis phase (developing a framework for how the content will be divided into modules).
- Phase 1 will be producing a prototype of the eLearning modules, while Phase 2 and 3 will focus on adapting the training to different specific audiences. Goal is to have a product deliverable by April.
- NorthBEAT is committed to providing both French and Indigenous translations of the training. This will likely take place in phase two or three.
- NorthBEAT has connected with a local Thunder Bay videographer who will be providing scenarios to be imbedded in the training modules, as well as editing the existing "What If?" video to be more representative of the Collaborative. A call will be sent out by email for volunteers to be actors in the scenarios in the next few months.
- As we continue on in the eLearning development process, conversations will happen within specific groups in the Collaborative as they may have different training needs.
- While we work on the content of the training modules, you will receive an additional survey to get a better sense of learning needs and context. This survey will be after the Check-In Survey is wrapped up.
